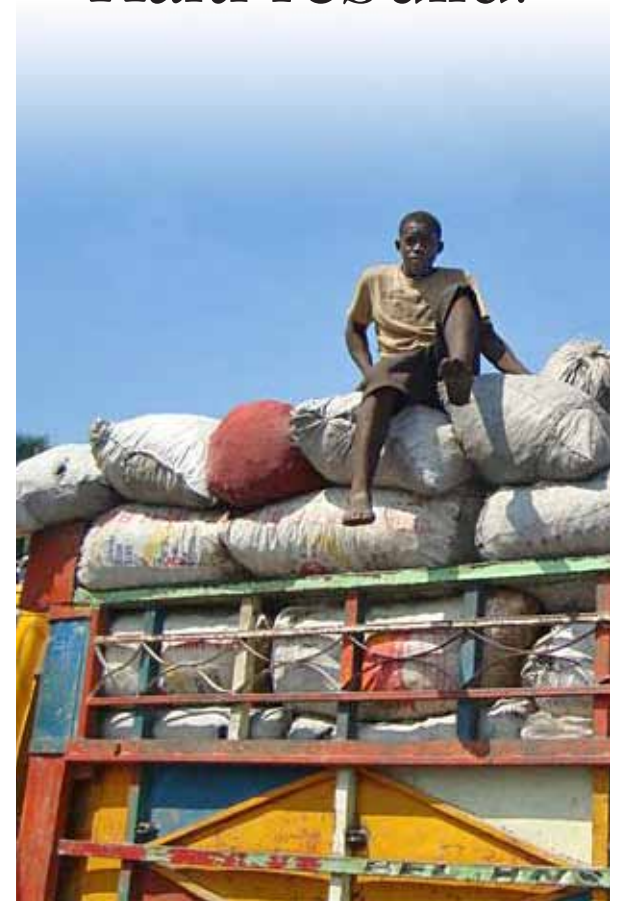

Our efforts take a pragmatic approach.

The **Public-Private Alliance Foundation** organizes Partners Against Poverty seminars at the United Nations; facilitates small business exports from Madagascar; and assists with aquaculture, agribusiness and microfinance in the Dominican Republic.

With several partners we held four seminars on bio-energy in 2009—two at the United Nations and two in the Dominican Republic. These examined ethanol as a fuel, prospects for investment, views of the public, private, academic and financial sectors, and implementation of the new Dominican law to promote renewable energy.

Since the January 2010 earthquake, we are helping Haitians find sustainable ways to revitalize Haiti.

In June we partnered with SImACT, Inc., a Haitian-American investment group, to convene a workshop in historic, damaged Jacmel. Over 100 Haitian and foreign business, government, and

non-profit participants explored possible collaborations for reconstruction, investment and commerce.

Areas of interest were: housing and infrastructure; downtown Jacmel revitalization; arts and artisans, tourism and eco-tourism; and promotion of ethanol cookstoves. We are now working with partners and local communities to implement all these prospects.

Burning wood and charcoal for cooking and small business is Haiti's greatest energy use. It has stripped the country bare, leading to erosion and hurricane mudslides. The fumes are health hazards, especially for women and children. Smoke and ash prevent cooking indoors.

Sugar has a long history in Haiti. Steps toward locally-produced ethanol as fuel for stoves made and distributed locally are now a special focus among several project partners. Our efforts aim to improve the lives and pocketbooks of families, provide jobs for farmers and small entrepreneurs, and reduce deforestation.
