### Consultation on Ethanol Cookstoves and Fuel at The United Nations

About 70 participated in PPAF's **Consultation on Ethanol Cookstoves and Fuel on April 4 at the United Nations**, sponsored by the UN Office for Partnerships and others. Originally planned for a smaller conference room, the event was moved to the Economic and Social Council Chamber, which gave great space for break-out group sessions.
