Announcing two major accomplishments

First - We are very happy to report that PPAF has brought together the Government of Benin and Project C.U.R.E. to ship over \$1 million of medical equipment and supplies to Benin. Scott Wright, Chair of the PPAF Board, has led this effort. He organized meetings during the UN General Assembly between representatives of the Foreign Ministry, the Permanent Mission of Benin and Project C.U.R.E. The Government of Benin is paying the costs of shipping several 40-foot sea freight containers holding over \$1 million of medical equipment and supplies.

PPAF has previously worked with the Government of Madagascar, the Permanent Mission of Madagascar to the UN and Project C.U.R.E. on a similar project. These projects help improve lives of people through better health care.

Second - PPAF's work in Haiti under a contract with the Inter-American Development Bank has been very successful. In three months' time PPAF sent two teams, including a microbiologist, agronomist and distillation specialist to work with local organizations. They assessed current practices and the scientific bases that could lead to improving production of high-proof alcohol for cookstove fuel.



The overall project included continuing pilot programs with families and organizations, building financial support for improved distillery equipment, encouraging improvements in sugarcane farming and a price elasticity study for both stoves and fuel in select communities.

We are happy that local distillers are already following the experts' recommendations and seeing improvement in sugar and alcohol output. Even small inputs of resources have measurable, important results. As production increases, prices can be expected to decrease, benefiting those who want to use ethanol stoves and to reduce the harmful practice of burning charcoal and wood.

Upcoming

On the basis of the Public-Private Alliance Foundation's work in its consultancy, the Inter-American Development Bank has invited David Stillman to participate on a panel in a **Workshop to Develop a National Bioenergy Action Plan for Haiti**. This will take place on December 10th in Port-au-Prince.

PPAF is working with various organizations to build upon the findings and recommendations from the consultancy with the IDB.

PPAF is also participating in actions related to the Decade of Sustainable Energy for All, which begins in 2014, and is contributing to the work of the UNA-USA Southern New York State Division's Energy Project.
